

GCSE Results Day

To achieve the GCSE grades that you need on results day is extremely rewarding, many congratulations! Next step is enrolment at sixth form or college for the course you intend to study. If your grades are better than expected, you might be able to apply for a different course or subject. Speak to your sixth form or college admissions.

If your grades did not meet the required target, you still have options.

- contact the school or college to discuss your options
- speak to your Careers adviser about your next step

You will have worked hard for those GCSEs so take time to acknowledge that and try not to get discouraged as there are other courses you might not have considered.

What are my options?

If the option you planned for is no longer available to you, do not panic.

- Check if there are other courses that might interest you, at a lower entry level.
- You may be able to do your course at Level 2 rather than at Level 3; this way you can ease your way in and work your way up.
- You might consider applying for an apprenticeship or
- Traineeship lasting up to six months to improve your Maths and English grades in addition to developing other skills before taking up an apprenticeship.

Sixth Form Colleges/FE Colleges and Enrolment

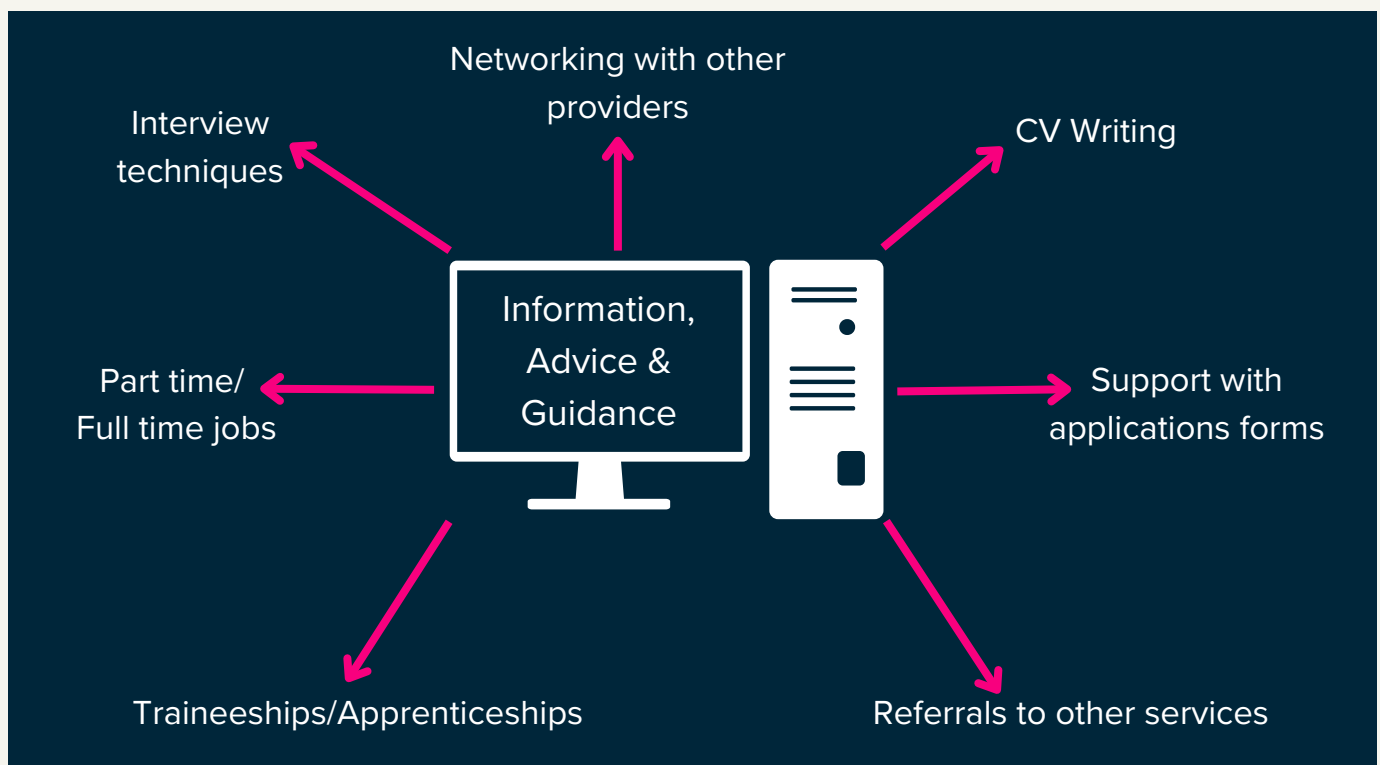
Colleges will inform you about enrolment if you have applied for a course and received an offer of a place. Otherwise, you might need to book online for an appointment or drop-in to speak to an adviser if this is offered. Check the college website for information about enrolment. You will need to take with you, your passport, GCSE results and any other information requested by the college depending on status (e.g., biometric card, EU Settlement documentation, etc.)
