



Headship Next is an 8-month development programme for aspiring headteachers ready to take the next step and make a lasting impact on outcomes for young people.



Safer Internet Day 2026 takes place on 10 February, focusing on the theme ‘Smart tech, safe choices – exploring the safe and responsible use of AI’.


The day will explore how AI affects everyday life, how it can be used positively, and how children and young people can be empowered to use it safely and responsibly.

-  Cyber security

-  Make informed, cost-effective decisions
-  Use technology safely and securely
-  Meet wider DfE digital and technology standards

DFE: Parents Prioritising Primary Schools with Free Breakfast Clubs

Press Release - 2 February 2026

From April, over 300,000 children will benefit from Best Start free breakfast clubs, helping families manage the cost of living while supporting children's learning and wellbeing.

Key impacts:

-  7 million meals already served
-  Families saving up to £450 per year
-  Up to 95 hours of time saved annually
-  Improved attendance, attainment and behaviour

The clubs are open to all pupils, helping to reduce stigma, with many parents more likely to access support when it is universal. The government is now encouraging more primary schools to sign up as demand continues to grow.

Using after-school clubs, tuition and community activities

Details

This guidance is for parents and carers. It explains what school and activities clubs, tutors and coaches should be doing to provide a safe environment for the children that attend their setting. This includes:


- **community activities** - for example, youth clubs
- **before- and after-school clubs**
- **holiday clubs**
- **supplementary schools** - for example, language, cultural and religious
- **private tuition**
- **music lessons**
- **sports training and coaching**

These are sometimes referred to as out-of-school settings.

DFE: Generative AI: Product Safety Standards

Guidance - 19 January 2026



Details

- **Guidance on the capabilities and features that generative AI products and systems should meet to be considered safe for users in educational settings.**
- **These standards are for edtech developers and suppliers to schools and colleges. Schools and colleges may also find them helpful in assessing which AI products are safe for use in education.**
- **You should also refer to Generative artificial intelligence (AI) in education.**

OFSTED: What the Government's Updated Guidance on Mobile Phones Means for School Inspections

Blog - 23 January 2026

The DfE has tightened guidance stating that schools should be mobile phone-free by default. Ofsted has reiterated full backing for schools to ban phones, as they often disrupt learning and wellbeing.

From 1 April, inspections will:

-  **Discuss schools' mobile phone policies and how they're communicated**
-  **Check understanding and consistency among staff and pupils**
-  **Evaluate the impact on learning, behaviour and wellbeing**

Schools that allow exceptions must clearly justify and apply them consistently. Where guidance isn't followed, inspectors will consider the impact on behaviour, focus, bullying and mental health—potentially affecting judgements.
